

The South African Society of Psychiatrists (SASOP) has embarked on a program "Human Rights for People with Mental Illness" during the second half of 2018, consisting of discussions and presentations in different cities (Johannesburg, Pretoria, Durban and Cape Town), as well as the travelling exhibition of the German Association for Psychiatry, Psychotherapy and Neurology (DGPPN), entitled "Registered, Persecuted, Annihilated - The Sick and the Disabled under National Socialism". The main theme of these discussions will be to explore the role of professional societies and individual clinicians to uphold and protect the human rights of people living with mental illness.
